Literature Seminar Courses

NOTE: ENGL 335/365 do NOT count in the literature seminar requirement

ENGL 350. Studies in Medieval Literature and Culture. 4 credits.

ENGL 361. Studies in Poetry. 4 credits.

Seminar in British, American, or World Anglophone poetry. Individual sections of this course may focus on a theme or a historical period, e.g., the epic, the sonnet, or pastoral poetry. **Prerequisite: ENGL 270.** This course may be repeated for credit, if the theme or historical period is different. Dependent on instructor availability.

ENGL 364. Shakespeare. 4 credits.

Seminar providing an overview of Shakespeare's canon and development by looking at his work in Renaissance and contemporary contexts, emphasizing both textual study and theatrical performance. May be writing intensive. Prerequisites: For majors, ENGL 270. For non-majors, one introductory literature course and junior standing. Dependent on instructor availability.

ENGL 370. Studies in African American Literature. 4 credits.

Seminar in the various traditions of African American writing. Individual sections may focus on the writing of African American women, the 20th-century novel, or other themes, forms, or historical developments.

Prerequisites: For majors, ENGL 270. For non-majors, ENGL 180 or ENGL 190 and junior standing. Dependent on instructor availability.

ENGL 371. Studies in World Anglophone Literature. 4 credits.
